

What's Different for Tisch Professional Track vs. NYU in London?

PRE-DEPARTURE:

Confirmation Procedure – you do not need to submit a deposit for the program if you are an NYU student. You do not need to accept or decline anything in Albert. You only need to complete the Tisch Special Programs Confirmation Form you received in your acceptance email. Visiting students will need to submit a deposit along with their confirmation form.

Registration – our office registers you for classes during registration week. You can only be registered if you have followed your typical registration procedures (meet with advisor) and in addition, have the Tisch Special Programs registration form signed by the advisor listed on the form and returned via email to tisch.special.services@nyu.edu.

Expenses – most expenses are the same with the exception of Tisch lab and study abroad program fees.

Supplemental Forms – you must complete all NYU in London Global Programs paperwork. IN ADDITION, you will also need to complete Tisch Special Programs Supplemental Forms found in your Top Apply application. You will be provided information on when to access these forms.

DURING YOUR PROGRAM:

Calendar – the check-in and check-out dates are the same for all students. The semester breaks ARE NOT THE SAME AS NYU IN LONDON. Here is the Tisch London calendar:

NYU Welcome and Orientation: September 1 - 4, 2016

Tisch Orientation: September 2, 2016 Classes Begin: September 5, 2016

Final Presentations of Writing students' work + RADA group: December 8 then 14 - 15, 2016

Check Out: December 17, 2016
